1. Wisdom will change your appearance about government.

• Solomon is a king writing about how to get along with the king.

• Answer to both questions in vs. 1 is: No one.

“interpretation” - פְּרִזְבָּר - pay-shar - solution, interpretation.

• In Solomon's day, the king had far-reaching power over his subjects.

Therefore it became imperative to avoid his wrath.

• If you are wise, wisdom will give you confidence which in turn, will be reflected on your face.

• Wisdom brings joy because a person who has biblical wisdom is assured of what is right.

• What do others see when they look at you? Do you have joy? If not, perhaps it's because you aren't taking in the wisdom of God's Word. It's not being integrated into your life and giving you joy.

• So to please the King will require wisdom.

• To deal with our government will require wisdom.

• Who is our “King?” 3 branches:

Executive – Legislative – Judicial

• In Solomon's time, the king possessed all of those responsibilities within his person.

2 I say, "Keep the command of the king because of the oath before God. II. Wisdom looks beyond those in government to One who is higher in control."

- There will be times when obeying the government will not be very convenient, when it will interfere with other things you want to do -
 - You may be summoned for jury duty just as you are leaving for vacation.
 - You may incur a zoning restriction in regard to some change you want to make in your home or some building you want to erect for your business.
 - You may not want to pay your taxes because you feel that they are a heavy burden.
- Human government has the right to collect taxes, to call people to jury duty, to draft soldiers into the army, to supervise businesses, education, medicine, to require people to wear masks, to require businesses to shut down for a period of time, to refrain from large gatherings, to shelter in place.
- When someone would enter into service of the king he would take an oath before God to be loyal to the king.
- To disobey the command of the king was to break your oath before God.
- Disobedience to one was disobedience to the other.
- Citizenship is serious. If you share in the blessings of government in a nation such as ours, you are also responsible to obey the authority and laws of that government.
- When you pledge allegiance to your country, God takes your pledge seriously.

III. Wisdom is careful not to be hasty in judgment nor quick to join in a revolt against the government.

• Do not be quick to turn your back government and take matters into your own hands.

Esther 2:21-23

21 In those days, while Mordecai was sitting at the king's gate, Bigthan and Teresh, two of the king's officials from those who guarded the door, became angry and sought to lay hands on King Ahasuerus.

22 But the plot became known to Mordecai and he told Queen Esther, and Esther informed the king in Mordecai's name.

23 Now when the plot was investigated and found to be so, they were both hanged on a gallows; and it was written in the Book of the Chronicles in the king's presence.

IV. Wisdom submits to the authority of government rather than always questioning government's authority and power and the decisions it is making.

• Government retains its authority under God.

• This is more than asking a simple honest question. This is criticism.

• We submit and we also vote. In some nations there is no vote. Our voice and criticism can come through our vote.

V. Wisdom chooses to obey the government and knows the proper channels and ways to be an influence for righteousness.

• When you drive the speed limit, you don't have to worry about speed traps.

• When you pay your taxes, you don't have to worry about an IRS audit.

• When you follow the building code, you don't need to worry about violations.

• When you close down your restaurant during a pandemic, you don't need to worry about the repercussions of keeping it open.

• We need to really think through how best to approach a problem that concerns government, and we should act only after we have made a careful decision.

VI. Wisdom exercises patience in properly going through the right channels of government, even though their subject is of great concern.

• Same kind of wording as 3:1 –

Eccl 3:1

1 There is an appointed time for everything. And there is a time for every event under heaven –

• God is sovereign over the affairs of government and those who are in government – therefore be patient. Handle it correctly.

Ps 22:28

8 For the kingdom is the Lord's And He rules over the nations.

Prov 21:1

1 The king's heart is like channels of water in the hand of the Lord; He turns it wherever He wishes.

Dan 2:21

21 "It is He who changes the times and the epochs;

He removes kings and establishes kings;

VII. Wisdom stays away from foolish speculation and prediction for the future of a government.

Is. 46:9-10

9 I am God, and there is no one like Me,

10 Declaring the end from the beginning,

And from ancient times things which have not been done, Saying, 'My purpose will be established, And I will accomplish all My good pleasure';

Let's just think about God's timing for a moment –

• How quickly did it take to knock down the Berlin wall? It occurred over one weekend.

• How quickly did it take for the Soviet socialistic republic to split apart? Not long.

• How long did it take for ancient Babylon to fall? 1 night.

• How long did it take for the wicked Haman in the book of Esther when all looked grim for the Jews, to be disposed of? A few days.

8 No man has authority to restrain the wind with the wind, or authority over the day of death; and there is no discharge in the time of war, and evil will not deliver those who practice it.

VIII. Wisdom recognizes that man has little control over what happens in the world.

Solomon offers four examples of an individual's lack of control over life:

(1) No one can restrain the wind with the wind,

(2) No one can control the day of his or her death,

(3) No soldier can discharge himself in time of war,

(4) Wicked deeds can never deliver evil doers.

• Since man has no control over so many things in life, no one has the solution to every problem or the answer to every question that might arise in our nation.

• Events that are beyond the control of everybody deny to everyone the ability to say what tomorrow holds.

X. Wisdom warns us that not correctly submitting to the government's authority can have grave consequences.

- Solomon observed and thought about how kings exercised their authority over those under them. His conclusion was that it is dangerous to disobey the authority of the king.

X. Wisdom instructs the believer to know his identity, his authority, his humility, and his ministry.

His identity:

Who does the believer identify with living in this world – a political party, a moral cause, a President, a nation?

His authority:

How much impact does a believer have towards influencing government?


His humility:
